Council Members Gary L. Crum, David A. Olson, Kathleen G. Armstrong, David B. Martin, and Jerold D. McDermid answered roll. No Council Member was absent. Clerk-Treasurer Ryan P. Herbert recorded the minutes.

Ordinance No. 1716-2022. AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ANGOLA MUNICIPAL CODE, TITLE 10 VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, CHAPTER 10.25 PARKING. was read by title and presented to Council on Second reading. Council Member Martin moved to approve. Council Member McDermid seconded the motion. The motion carried 5-0.

The public hearing regarding the 2023 Budget was declared open at 7:03 p.m. There being no public comment the hearing was closed at 7:04 p.m. Ordinance No. 1717-2022. ORDINANCE FOR APPROPRIATIONS AND TAX RATES, was read by title and presented to Council for first reading. Council Member Martin moved to approve. Council Member Crum seconded the motion. The motion to approve carried 5-0.

County Commissioner Wil Howard presented the request form the Steuben County Board of Commissioners to vacate the portion of South Martha Street lying between East South Street and Wall Street. Discussion followed. No formal action was taken.

CLERK-TREASURER AND DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS

Clerk-Treasurer Herbert reported the State Board of Accounts is planning the exit conference for the 2020 and 2021 audit for October 17th.

Planning and Economic Development Director Barclay reported that there were around 4,000 visitors downtown for Cruise to the Monument according The Steuben County Tourism Bureau. Also, four of the downtown sculptures are set to be replaced in October.

APPROVAL OF ACCOUNTS PAYABLE VOUCHERS

Council Member Martin moved to approve the Allowance of Accounts Payable Vouchers 59295 through 59493 totaling \$577,495.86. Council Member Armstrong seconded the motion. The motion carried 5-0.
