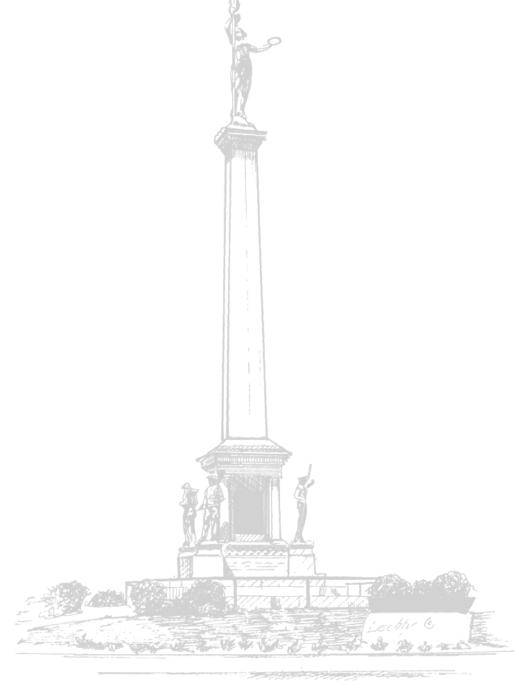

#### **December 1, 2025**

The regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Angola, Indiana was called to order at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall, 210 North Public Square, with Mayor David B. Martin presiding. Council Members Randy Coffey, David A. Olson, Charles P. Dowe, Jennifer L. Sharkey, and Jerold D. McDermid answered roll. No Council Member was absent. Clerk-Treasurer Ryan P. Herbert recorded the minutes.

Among those present were City Attorney Kim Shoup, City Engineer Amanda Cope, Police Chief Ken Whitmire, Street Commissioner Chad Ritter, Water Superintendent Mitchel Sattison, Wastewater Superintendent Jeff Gaff, Human Resources Director Sue Essman, and Fire Battalion Chief Jason Meek.

## APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

Council Member Olson moved to approve November 17, 2025, minutes. Council Member Coffey seconded the motion. The motion carried 5-0.

#### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

Ordinance No. 1793-2025, AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ANGOLA MUNICIPAL CODE, TITLE 10 VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, CHAPTER 10.25 PARKING, was read by title and presented to Council on third and final reading. ### DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS

City Engineer Cope reported that INDOT had sent an email and the City has been awarded \$234,000 out of the \$1,000,000 that was applied for through the Community Crossings Grant. This is a significant decrease from past years and will be enough to cover one street. It goes to show the changes to the program and the importance of finding other funding to bridge the gap in funding.

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF ANGOLA, INDIANA EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK, PAYROLL STANDARDS, CANINE CARE PAY

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Angola, Indiana that the Employee Handbook is being amended by the text of existing provisions in this style type, additions will appear in **this style type**, and deletions will appear in **this style type**:

Section 1. Payroll Standards, Canine Care Pay is amended to read as follows:

#### Canine Care Pay

A police officer assigned to a narcotic detection dog (K9) and a firefighter assigned to an arson investigation dog will be compensated eight (8) fourteen (14) hours\* for off-duty dog care activities for each 28-day work period. Canine Care Pay begins when approved training has been completed and the K9 and their handler begin working their assigned shift. when the department acquires the canine and ends when the canine is retired from service with the department.

Canine Care Pay is considered work time and applies toward the calculation of overtime.

• The K-9 police officer will be provided with one 8-hour shift off, paid out at fourteen (14) hours per 28-day pay period.

Section 2. Effective date.

This ordinance shall be effective beginning with the payroll period that begins on December 21, 2025 and in full force and effect upon passage and adoption by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.

WHEREAS, funding is available, and the Common Council wishes to increase compensation of said appointed officers, deputies, other employees, police and firefighters for the year 2026;

NOW THEREFORE, be it hereby ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Angola, Steuben County, Indiana that Ordinance No. 1781-2025, Section 1 is being amended by the text of existing provisions in this style type, additions in **this style type**, and deletions in this style type:

# **2026 FIRE PROTECTION AGREEMENT**

This agreement is between Jackson Township of Steuben County, Indiana and the City of Angola for the fire protection of Jackson Township. The agreement is as follows:

- The department will provide Firefighting / Medical Services of the following part of Jackson Township: North line (400N) going south on (550W) to (300N) turning West to (600W) East side ONLY then going South until (US 20) then turning East from US 20 and 600W to (500W) or Jackson Township East line.
- 2. Jackson Township will pay the sum of \$7,000 payable twice a year. 1st sum of \$3,500.00 prior to June 30th. The remaining sum of \$3,500.00 prior to December 31st.
- 3. The said payments are by the parties deemed to be in full settlement and discharge of the Jackson Township share of all insurance, automobile and all the other operating allowances required or permitted by law to be provided to the City of Angola Department, it's being agreed that such legally required insurance and allowances will be procured by the department listed above.
- 4. The terms of this agreement will be from January 1st through December 31st for the year 2026.
- **5.** This agreement is subject to approval by the State Board of Accounts, Department of Local Government Finance and all other relevant government agencies.
