

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF ANGOLA, INDIANA CODE OF  
ORDINANCES ESTABLISHING FEES FOR SERVICES OF THE PLAN  
COMMISSION, THE BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS, THE HISTORIC  
PRESERVATION COMMISSION, AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT &  
PLANNING DEPARTMENT**

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Angola, Indiana that Title 15 Buildings and Construction, Chapter 15.05 General Provisions is being amended by the text of existing provisions in this style type, additions will appear in **this style type**, and deletions will appear in ~~this style type~~:

Section 1. Subsection (D) of Section 15.05.050 Fees for services of the Plan Commission, the Board of Zoning Appeals, the Historic Preservation Commission, and the Economic Development and Planning Department is amended to read as follows:

(D) The following fees shall be charged for the services offered by the Economic Development & Planning Department:

- (1) Improvement Location Permit \$25
  - a. ~~With Building Permit \$0~~
- (2) Sign Permit \$25 per sign

This ordinance shall become effective following passage and adoption by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO PURSUE THE PURCHASE  
OF PROPERTY LOCATED NORTH OF REDDING ROAD**

WHEREAS, IC 36-1-10.5-5 governs procedures to purchase land or structures by a political subdivision;

WHEREAS, the City of Angola has expressed an interest in purchasing certain real property for the purposes of use by the Parks Department;

WHEREAS, the City of Angola being a political subdivision and the Common Council being the fiscal body of the City of Angola, Indiana, said Common Council may pass a resolution that it is interested in making a purchase of specified land;

WHEREAS, Fairhaven Development owns certain parcels of real estate in the City of Angola, Pleasant Township, Steuben County, Indiana, described as:

WHEREAS, said real estate would serve the City's purposes;

THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Angola, Steuben County, Indiana that the Mayor (or his designee) authorized as a designated Purchasing Agent to appoint two (2) appraisers, who are professionally engaged in making appraisals or trained as an appraiser and licensed as a broker under IC 25-34.1, to appraise the fair market value of the property. The Mayor then provide a copy of both appraisals to the Common Council. Mayor (or his designee) is authorized to purchase said property for no more than the average of the two appraisals.
