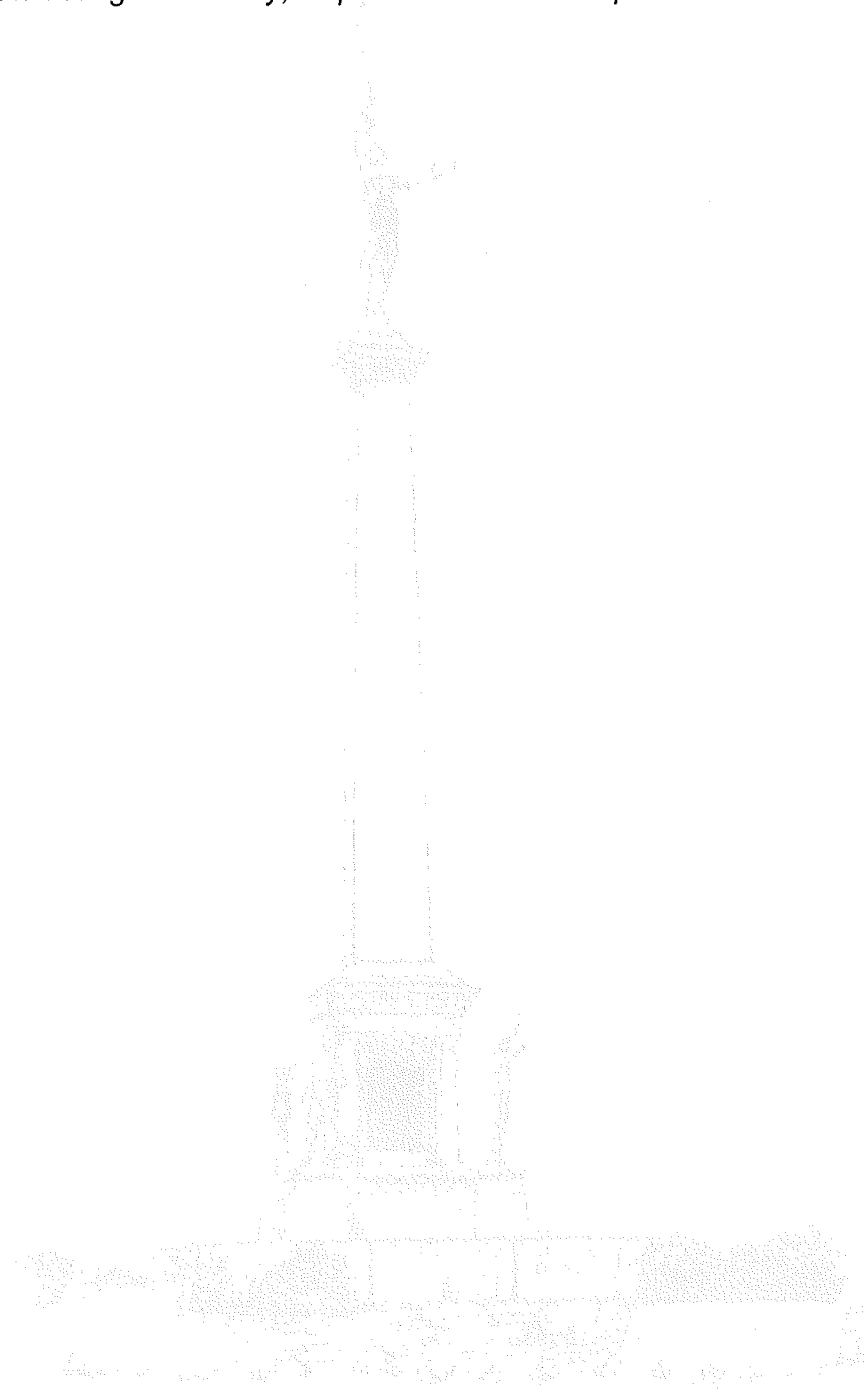

AUGUST 19, 2019

The regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Angola, Indiana was called to order at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall, Council Chambers, 210 North Public Square, with Mayor Richard M. Hickman presiding. Councilmembers Gary L. Crum, David A. Olson, Kathleen G. Armstrong, David B. Martin, and Joseph M. Hysong answered roll call. No Councilmember was absent. Clerk-Treasurer Debra A. Twitchell recorded the minutes.

Present were Chief of Police Stu Hamblen, City Attorney Kim Shoup, City Engineer Amanda Cope, Deputy Clerk Tammy Onofrietti, Human Resources Administrator Sue Essman, Water Superintendent Tom Selman, Wastewater Superintendent Craig Williams, and Park Superintendent Matt Hanna.

Also present were Ashlee Hoos of *The Herald Republican*, Colin Meadowcroft of WLKI, Libby Hysong, and James Smith.

REMARKS BY THE MAYOR

Mayor Hickman announced the City's assessed value for pay 2020 increased almost \$33 million to \$464,432,414. At the maximum levy the tax rate would decrease \$0.0453 to \$1.1818.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

Councilmember Olson moved to approve the August 5, 2019 minutes. Councilmember Crum seconded the motion. The motion carried 5-0.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Ordinance No. 1614-2019, AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ANGOLA MUNICIPAL CODE, CHAPTER 8.05 SOLID WASTE, was presented for third and final reading. Councilmember Hysong moved to approve. Councilmember Martin seconded the motion. Motion carried 5-0. (residence charge from \$14.00 to \$14.50)

Ordinance No. 1615-2019, AN ORDINANCE DEFINING ADDRESSING SPECIFICATIONS FOR BUILDINGS WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF ANGOLA, INDIANA, was read by title and presented to Council for third and final reading. Councilmember Armstrong moved to approve. Councilmember Crum seconded the motion. The motion carried 5-0.

Ordinance No. 1616-2019, AN ORDINANCE FIXING COMPENSATION OF APPOINTED OFFICERS, DEPUTIES AND OTHER EMPLOYEES AND OF POLICE AND FIREFIGHTERS FOR THE CITY OF ANGOLA, INDIANA FOR THE YEAR 2020, was presented to Council for second reading. Councilmember Martin moved to

approve. Councilmember Hysong seconded the motion. The motion carried 5-0. (1% increase; 27 pay days)

Council considered the recommendation from V3 Companies, Ltd. regarding the Angola Streetscape Improvements project which consists of sidewalk and landscape rehabilitation on South Wayne Street from Gale Street to Public Square. V3 is the engineer on the project. Bids were opened August 5 and the matter tabled. V3's opinion is the large discrepancy between the engineer's estimate and the low bid was because the project was bid in the peak of construction season, there were only two bidders, and several of the electrical related items were priced much higher than expected. City Engineer Cope concurred. V3 recommended that the City rebid later this year or very early 2020 to get ahead of the construction season. Councilmember Martin moved to reject all bids. Councilmember Crum seconded the motion. The motion carried 5-0.

NEW BUSINESS

Ordinance No. 1617-2019, AN ORDINANCE FIXING COMPENSATION OF ELECTED OFFICIALS OF THE CITY OF ANGOLA, INDIANA FOR THE YEAR 2020, was read by title and presented to Council on first reading. Councilmember Martin moved to adopt and amend the ordinance with a one percent increase for the mayor and clerk-treasurer and no increase for councilmembers. Councilmember Olson seconded the motion. Councilmember Martin explained the increase for the mayor and clerk-treasurer is the same as employees. In addition, the ordinance includes recognition of professional certifications for the mayor and clerk-treasurer. Discussion followed. Councilmember Olson called the question. On call of the vote, the motion to adopt as amended carried 5-0.

Ordinance No. 1618-2019, AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ANGOLA MUNICIPAL CODE, TITLE 10 VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, CHAPTER 10.15 TRAFFIC, SECTION 10.15.150 SPEED LIMITS, was read by title and presented to Council on first reading. Councilmember Olson moved to approve. Councilmember Hysong seconded the motion. The motion carried 5-0. (add Regency Drive 25 mph)

Resolution No. 2019-761, A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE TRANSFER OF APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE CITY OF ANGOLA FOR THE GENERAL AND PARKS AND RECREATION OPERATING FUNDS AND FORWARDED TO THE COMMON COUNCIL FOR THEIR ACTION PURSUANT TO IC 6-1.1-18.6, was read by title and presented to Council for approval. Councilmember Olson moved to approve. Councilmember Crum seconded the motion. The motion carried 5-0. (General – Office of Economic Development and Planning and Engineering)

Council considered the 2020 funding request from Steuben County Economic Development Corporation in the amount of \$59,430. The amount is the same as 2019. Councilmember Armstrong moved to approve the request. Councilmember Crum seconded the motion. The motion carried 5-0.

Council then considered the City of Angola Façade Grant Agreement with Libby Hysong/B and H Entertainment, Inc./Hysong Holdings, LLC dba Monument Pizza Pub located at 80 North Public Square in the amount not to exceed \$5,000. Councilmember Hysong stated because he has a financial interest in the property that he will not partake in discussion or vote on the matter. Libby Hysong explained the project includes a new roof and façade painting. Councilmember Armstrong moved to approve the agreement. Councilmember Crum seconded the motion. Discussion followed. The motion carried 4-0.

Jim Smith, Municipal Services Manager with Republic Services, reported collection statistics through June. Discussion followed. Smith stated there is trouble with costs and would prefer to recycle biweekly to save costs. Mayor Hickman reminded Smith that if the service changes, then the City must rebid the contract. Smith acknowledged the same. No action was taken by Council.

The Clerk-Treasurer's Depository Statement and Cash Reconciliation for the month of July 2019 was presented to Council.

CLERK-TREASURER AND DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS

Water Superintendent Selman reported a lightning strike at the satellite water treatment plant (550 Pokagon Trail) on Sunday (August 18) at 11:00 a.m. Work to restore operations was completed at 8:30 p.m. At 9:30 p.m., a main break was reported at 602 North Martha Street. The break eventually became four breaks and took until 6:00 a.m. on Monday to repair. The infrastructure is old, and a lot of communities are having the same problems with main breaks. Angola has a small crew and did a lot of work in less than 24 hours.

Wastewater Superintendent Williams reported Mechanic Street was closed today for repair on the concrete sanitary sewer. The street should be open Tuesday evening.

Chief of Police Hamblen reported the K-9 Run and Dog Day in the Park on Saturday, August 17 was well attended. Hamblen also reported the department was assisted by the state police and various city and town police departments in apprehending the Shell station (1811 North Wayne Street) armed robbery suspects. Hamblen publicly thanked those assisting.

APPROVAL OF ACCOUNTS PAYABLE VOUCHERS

Councilmember Martin moved to approve the Allowance of Accounts Payable Vouchers 41855 through 42108 totaling \$766,857.58 which includes interfund transfers of \$180,672.77. Councilmember Crum seconded the motion. The motion carried 5-0.

OTHER NEW BUSINESS

Councilmember Hysong stated he has been approached about a changing station at the Monument Plaza women's restroom. There is a changing station in the family restroom.

There being no further business, the meeting was considered adjourned at 7:39 p.m.

ORDINANCE NO. 1616-2019

**AN ORDINANCE FIXING COMPENSATION OF APPOINTED OFFICERS,
DEPUTIES, AND OTHER EMPLOYEES AND OF POLICE AND
FIREFIGHTERS OF THE CITY OF ANGOLA, INDIANÁ FOR THE YEAR 2020**

WHEREAS, IC 36-4-7-3 and IC 36-4-11-4 governs the fixing of compensation of City appointed officers, deputies, and other employees;

WHEREAS, IC 36-8-3-3 governs the fixing of compensation of police and firefighters;

WHEREAS, funding is available, and the Common Council wishes to increase compensation of said appointed officers, deputies, other employees, police and firefighters for the year 2020;

NOW THEREFORE, be it hereby ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Angola, Steuben County, Indiana:

Section 1. From and after December 29, 2019 and continuing through December 26, 2020 the minimum and maximum compensation and pay schedule for appointed officers, deputies, and other employees and police and firefighters of the City of Angola shall be fixed as follows:

Section 2. New and incumbent employees.

- (A) Except for employees of the Clerk-Treasurer, the Office of the Mayor will evaluate and approve appointed officers, deputies, and other employees and police and firefighters (employee) compensation as follows:
 - (1) Compensation shall be within the minimum and maximum established by the salary ordinance and any amendments thereto.
 - (2) When establishing compensation, due consideration shall be given to the following:
 - (a) the skills, qualifications, and training of the employee;
 - (b) the review and recommendation of the department head as documented on the Employee Performance Review; and
 - (c) any other factors as the Office of the Mayor deems important in establishing compensation.
- (B) The Clerk-Treasurer is hereby authorized to grant the above compensation to employees of the Office of Clerk-Treasurer as follows:
 - (1) Compensation shall be within the minimum and maximum established by the salary ordinance and any amendments thereto.
 - (2) When establishing compensation, due consideration shall be given to the following:
 - (a) the skills, qualifications, and training of the employee;
 - (b) the review and recommendation of the Clerk-Treasurer as documented on the Employee Performance Review.

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Section 3. Compensation adjustments.

The Office of the Clerk-Treasurer shall be notified in writing by the Office of the Mayor of all employee compensation adjustments and the effective date.

Section 4. Police department.

- (A) Police department officers shall receive longevity pay over and above base salary \$6.00 per month for each year of service.
- (B) Full-time, non-exempt officers shall receive shift differential pay whose regular shift assignment is B or C shift of \$2,000 per year. Bi-weekly salary will be adjusted to reflect the shift differential. In the case of a mid-year shift reassignment, bi-weekly salary will be adjusted accordingly, beginning the first Sunday following reassignment. Shift differential will not apply in case of sporadic or temporary shift changes.
- (C) The hourly rate of police officers who are not exempt from the provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) and who are working the 28-day work period shall
 - (1) receive hourly rate for all hours over and above scheduled hours. Hourly rate is based on 2,223 hours per salary ordinance year (13 28-day work periods times 171 hours); and
 - (2) receive overtime for all hours worked over 171 hours in a 28-day work period.
- (D) Compensation for full-time police department officers hired on or after September 1, 2008 will be as follows:
 - (1) Probationary Patrol Officer – beginning with the hire date and continuing through the first year of continuous service with the Angola Police Department.
 - (2) Patrol Officer – beginning with the second year and continuing through the fourth years of continuous service with the Angola Police Department.
 - (3) First Class Patrol Officer – beginning with the fifth years of continuous service with the Angola Police Department.
 - (4) After completion of one year of continuous service as Probationary Patrol Officer, the Chief of Police may recommend 1st Class Patrol Officer status for an officer who has had previous full-time police experience of at least three years, has successfully completed the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy, and has displayed a level of performance with the department, which would warrant consideration. Such recommendation shall be carefully considered and must receive approval from the Office of the Mayor.
- (E) Upon the award of a federal or state grant for additional policing activities, police department officers who are voluntarily working additional policing activities during regularly scheduled off-duty hours shall receive the hourly rate specified by the grant or, in the absence of a grant hourly rate, the hourly

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rate of \$18 - \$30 as determined by the Chief of Police.

- (F) Part-time School Crossing Guards will receive shift pay on regularly scheduled school days that are cancelled.

Section 5. Fire department.

- (A) The hourly rate of firefighters who are not exempt from the provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) and who are working the 28-day work period shall
 - (1) receive hourly rate based on 2,756 hours per salary ordinance year (13 28-day work periods times 212 hours); and
 - (2) receive overtime for all hours worked over 212 hours in a 28-day work period.
- (B) Compensation for full-time fire department firefighters hired on or after September 1, 2008 will be as follows:
 - (1) Probationary Firefighter - beginning with the hire date and continuing through the first year of continuous service with the Angola Fire Department.
 - (2) Firefighter – beginning with the second year and continuing through the fourth year of continuous service with the Angola Fire Department.
 - (3) First Class Firefighter - beginning with the fifth year of continuous service with the Angola Fire Department.
 - (4) After completion of one year of continuous service as Probationary Firefighter, the Fire Chief may recommend 1st Class Firefighter status for a firefighter who has had previous full-time firefighting experience of at least three years, successfully completed and holds an Indiana First Class Firefighter Certification or equivalent, and has displayed a level of performance with the department which would warrant consideration. Such recommendation shall be carefully considered and must receive approval from the Office of the Mayor.

Section 6. Effective date.

This ordinance shall become and remain in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.

WHEREAS, IC 36-4-7-2 governs the fixing of annual compensation of elected city officers;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Angola, Steuben County, Indiana:

Section 1. Mayor.

(A) That the compensation of the Mayor shall be paid biweekly and shall be hereby fixed from and after the December 29, 2019 and continuing through December 26, 2020 as set forth below:

(1) That the compensation for a Mayor possessing two or more state or nationally recognized professional certifications relating to public sector administration or management from a generally accepted professional association is hereby fixed:

(C) In addition, if the Mayor is a member of the Board of Public Works and Safety, the Mayor shall receive the \$3,250.00 annual compensation of a Board of Public Works and Safety member to be paid biweekly.

Section 2. Clerk-Treasurer.

TITLE 10 VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, CHAPTER 10.15 TRAFFIC,
SECTION 10.15.150 SPEED LIMITS**

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Angola, Indiana that the Angola Municipal Code is being amended by the text of existing provisions in this style type, additions in **this style type**, and deletions in ~~this style type~~:

Section 1. Section 10.15.150 Speed limits is amended to read as follows:

The speed limits on the following streets shall be as indicated:

<i>Street</i>	<i>Speed Limit (mph)</i>
Chaudoin Drive	20
East US Highway 20 between the posted school zone signs, a distance of 867 feet, when the amber “school zone” lights are activated	25
Growth Parkway	35
North Powers Street between West Broad Street and West Mill Street	25
Pokagon Trail	35
Regency Drive from Northcrest Drive to East Harcourt Road	25
Shoup Street from West Maumee Street (US Highway 20) south 0.51 miles to the city limits	35
South Wayne Street between Water Street and West Pleasant Street, a distance of 681 feet, when the amber “school zone” lights are activated	25
South Wayne Street northbound and southbound from Pleasant Street to the south city limits	35
