#### **AUGUST 3, 2020**

The regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Angola, Indiana was called to order at 7:01 p.m. at the Angola Training Center, 306 West Mill Street 1B, with Mayor Richard M. Hickman presiding. Council Members Gary L. Crum, David A. Olson, Jerold D. McDermid, and Kathleen G. Armstrong answered roll call. Council Member David B. Martin was absent. Clerk-Treasurer Debra A. Twitchell recorded the minutes.

Among those present were Chief of Police Stu Hamblen, City Attorney Kim Shoup, Economic Development and Planning Director Vivian Likes, Street Wastewater Superintendent Craig Williams, Water Superintendent Tom Selman, and Deputy Clerk Ryan Herbert.

Also, among those present were Ashlee Hoos of *The Herald Republican* and Colin Meadowcroft of WLKI.

#### REMARKS BY MAYOR HICKMAN

Mayor Hickman reported that Steuben County will remove the statues of the soldiers from the monument on Friday, August 7 between 6:00 a.m. and 10 a.m. for repairs. Steuben County will also do other upkeep to the monument while the statues are removed for repairs. The Mound will be a construction zone during this time and only the workers, the Garden Club, and City employees mowing should be in this area.

#### APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

Council Member Olson moved to approve the July 20, 2020 minutes. Council Member Crum seconded the motion. The motion carried 4-0.

#### UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Ordinance No. 1643-2020, AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF ANGOLA BY CHANGING THE LAND USE CLASSIFICATIONS OF THE CERTAIN AREA DESCRIBED HEREIN FROM MEDIUM DENSITY SINGLE-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL (R2) DISTRICT AND AGRICULTURAL (AG) DISTRICT TO HIGH DENSITY MULTIPLE-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL (R5) DISTRICT, was read by title and presented to Council on third and final reading. Council Member McDermid then stated having reviewed the findings of the Plan Commission and taking into account the comprehensive plan, current conditions and character of the structures and uses in each district, the most desirable use of the land in its current and proposed zones, conservation of property value throughout the City, and responsible growth development moved to adopt the proposed zoning change subject to the commitment that was tendered. Council Member Armstrong seconded the motion. It was reported that the signed commitment had been received. The motion to approve on third and final reading carried 4-0. (east from Westview Drive onto both Meyers and Koehlinger Streets)

Ordinance No. 1644-2020, AN ORDINANCE FIXING COMPENSATION OF APPOINTED OFFICERS, DEPUTIES, AND OTHER EMPLOYEES AND OF POLICE AND FIREFIGHTERS OF THE CITY OF ANGOLA, INDIANA FOR THE YEAR 2021, was read by title and presented to Council on third and final reading. Council Member Olson moved to approve. Council Member Crum seconded the motion. The motion to approve on third and final reading 4-0. (2% increase)

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Ordinance No. 1647-2020, AN ORDINANCE FIXING COMPENSATION OF ELECTED OFFICIALS OF THE CITY OF ANGOLA, INDIANA FOR THE YEAR 2021, was read by title and presented to Council for first reading. Council Member Olson moved to approve. Council Member Armstrong seconded the motion. The motion to approve on first reading carried 4-0. (Mayor and Clerk-Treasurer 2% increase)

#### CLERK-TREASURER AND DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS

Economic Development and Planning Director Likes reported that the application for the OCRA COVID recovery plan had been submitted on Friday (July 31). There should be a response by the end of August.

Wastewater Superintendent Williams reported that the department been testing influent from the entire system for COVID-19 through a company called Bio-Bot since the end of March. This testing gives an estimate of how many system users have the virus. The department will now begin sampling a segment that is MSD schools and will partner with the Indiana Finance Authority to sample the influent from a Trine University lift station. Bio-Bot is working to refine their process. Estimates for the entire City since the beginning of the program have shown from 20 to 200 users having COVID per given sample period. This information is forwarded to the Steuben County Health Department and will be provided to MSD and Trine for their areas also. This sampling is a great way to identify any problems or surges to stay ahead of any potential crisis. Discussion followed.

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Water Superintendent Selman reiterated that there is no threat of COVID-19 in the drinking water system.

## APPROVAL OF ACCOUNTS PAYABLE VOUCHERS

Council Member Olson moved to approve the Allowance of Accounts Payable Vouchers 47086 through 47259 totaling \$806,259.10. Council Member McDermid seconded the motion. The motion carried 4-0.

#### JULY 6, 2020

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Angola, Indiana was called to order by Chair Richard M. Hickman at 1:30 p.m. at the Angola Training Center, 306 West Mill Street 1B. Members Richard M. Hickman, David B. Martin, and David A. Olson answered roll call. No Member was absent. Clerk-Treasurer Debra A. Twitchell recorded the minutes.

Among those present were Assistant Chief of Police Ken Whitmire, City Attorney Kim Shoup, Building Commissioner Scott Lehman, Fire Chief TR Hagerty, Economic Development and Planning Director Vivian Likes, Street Commissioner Doug Anderson, City Engineer Amanda Cope, Wastewater Superintendent Craig Williams, Water Superintendent Tom Selman, and Systems Administrator Nathan Armstrong.

Also, among those present was Ashlee Hoos of The Herald Republican.

#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Member Olson moved to approve the June 1, 2020 minutes. Member Martin seconded the motion. On call of the vote, the motion carried 3-0.

#### ORDER OF BUSINESS

Tabled from the June 1 meeting, the Board was asked to consider drainage concerns at 507 Fox Lake Road. Property owner Mark Heifner was not present. Member Martin having consulted with City Attorney Shoup stated the matter is a neighborhood issue and a civil matter. Heifner needs to seek a remedy on his own. Discussion regarding homeowner's associations and the City enforcing the organization of such associations when approving subdivisions was had. No action was taken by the Board.

The Board considered a request by Jim Mutton, M & P LLP, to waive the construction performance surety when phasing the Eastland Crossings subdivision located along State Road 827. Mutton addressed the Board and requested that a bond not be required on the second and third phases of the project with the understanding a bond would be required for the first phase. Discussion followed. City Engineer Cope shared a long term concern is if the second and third phases are not completed then the looping of the water main would not be completed. More discussion followed. City Attorney Shoup recommended the City enter a written agreement with Mutton that he will not sell lots in subsequent phases or the residue of property without construction of the water main extension along State Road 827. Mutton agreed. More discussion ensued. Member Martin moved to enter into an agreement with M & P LLP that complies with City ordinances. Member Hickman seconded the motion. Discussion followed. The motion carried 3-0. (Angola Municipal Code 18.156.310(3))

The Board then considered the Request to Accept Infrastructure by JICI Construction, Inc. for the area of Terrace Buck Lake located along West US Highway 20. Representing JICI, Ken Wilson read a statement and then respectfully requested the City accept the infrastructure. Prolonged discussion followed. City Attorney Shoup made the point that the City has no obligation to accept any infrastructure and that private development is subject to laws of the State of Indiana and the City. City Attorney Shoup then advised not accepting anything that the City has not set forth clearly in an ordinance. More discussion followed. Wilson agreed to provide tickets for the street work patching and placement of asphalt surface. Water Superintendent Selman explained the water main is too deep to fix if repairs are needed. More discussion ensued. Member Hickman stated he wants the water main and hydrant issues resolved. A financial partnership was suggested. Member Martin suggested getting some numbers on paper and memorialized to get the acceptance resolved. Wilson stated he wants the project completed properly and quickly. Wilson was then directed to use Mayor Hickman as the point of contact for the City. No other infrastructure concerns were discussed. No action was taken by the Board.

A request to approve the Stormwater Management/BMP Facilities Agreement with Three Rivers Federal Credit Union for property located at 2998 Boyer Way was considered by the Board. Member Martin moved to approve. Member Olson seconded the motion. Discussion followed. The motion carried 3-0.

A request to approve the Stormwater Management/BMP Facilities Agreement with JK Property Investments, LLC for property located at 400 North Terrace Boulevard was considered by the Board. Member Martin moved to approve. Member Hickman seconded the motion. Discussion followed. The motion carried 3-0.

A request to approve the Stormwater Management/BMP Facilities Agreement with New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC, commonly known at AT&T Wireless for property located at 101 Woodhull Drive was considered by the Board. Member Martin moved to approve. Member Olson seconded the motion. Discussion followed. The motion carried 3-0.

### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ANGOLA MUNICIPAL CODE, TITLE 3 REVENUE AND FINANCE, CHAPTER 3.10 FUNDS BY ADDING A FIRE OPERATING FUND

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Angola, Indiana that Title 3 Revenue and Finance, Chapter 3.10 Funds, 3.10.150 Fire Operating Fund is added to read as follows:

#### Section 1. Fund established.

There is hereby established a fund to be known as the Fire Operating Fund.

#### Section 2. Sources of funding.

- (1) General property taxes with a levy set within the City's maximum levy.
- (2) Financial institutions tax.
- (3) Vehicle/aircraft excise tax.
- (4) Commercial vehicle excise tax.
- (5) Federal grants (public safety).
- (6) State grants (public safety).
- (7) Fire protection contracts.
- (8) Miscellaneous revenues.

## Section 3. Uses of funding.

The operations of the City Fire Department including but not limited to:

- (1) Personal services: salaries, wages, benefits, and pensions for full-time and part-time employees;
- (2) Supplies: office supplies, gasoline and diesel, vehicle supplies and parts, household and cleaning supplies, repair and maintenance supplies, repair parts, and small tools and minor equipment;
- (3) Services and charges: legal and professional services, shipping, travel expense including training, telephone, worker's compensation insurance, property and liability insurance, vehicle and equipment repairs and maintenance, equipment rentals, subscriptions, and organization membership and dues; and
- (4) Capital outlays: vehicles and firefighting equipment.

Section 4. The Fire Operating Fund shall exist until terminated by ordinance of the Common Council. Any remaining fund balance shall revert to the General Fund.

#### Section 5. Effective date.

This ordinance shall take effect January 1, 2021.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Angola, Steuben County, Indiana:

Section 1. Mayor.

- (A) That the compensation of the Mayor shall be paid biweekly and shall be hereby fixed from and after the December 27, 2020 and continuing through December 25, 2021 as set forth below:
  - (1) That the compensation for a Mayor possessing two or more state or nationally recognized professional certifications relating to public sector administration or management from a generally accepted professional association is hereby fixed:

Bids were opened on July 20, 2020 for the project. One bid was received.

As read at the bid opening, the bidder was Primco Inc. with a base bid of \$352,933.25. They included an add alternate price of \$139,296.25 for painting of the MSE walls.

We have reviewed the bid from Primco Inc. and it appears to be complete and responsive to the bidding documents. We understand there may be some concern with only having one bidder. Given the current construction market and the specialty type of construction this project is we would recommend the project being awarded to Primco Inc. We would defer to council for the acceptance of the add alternate. The contract can be awarded at this point pending the decision on the acceptance of the add alternate.

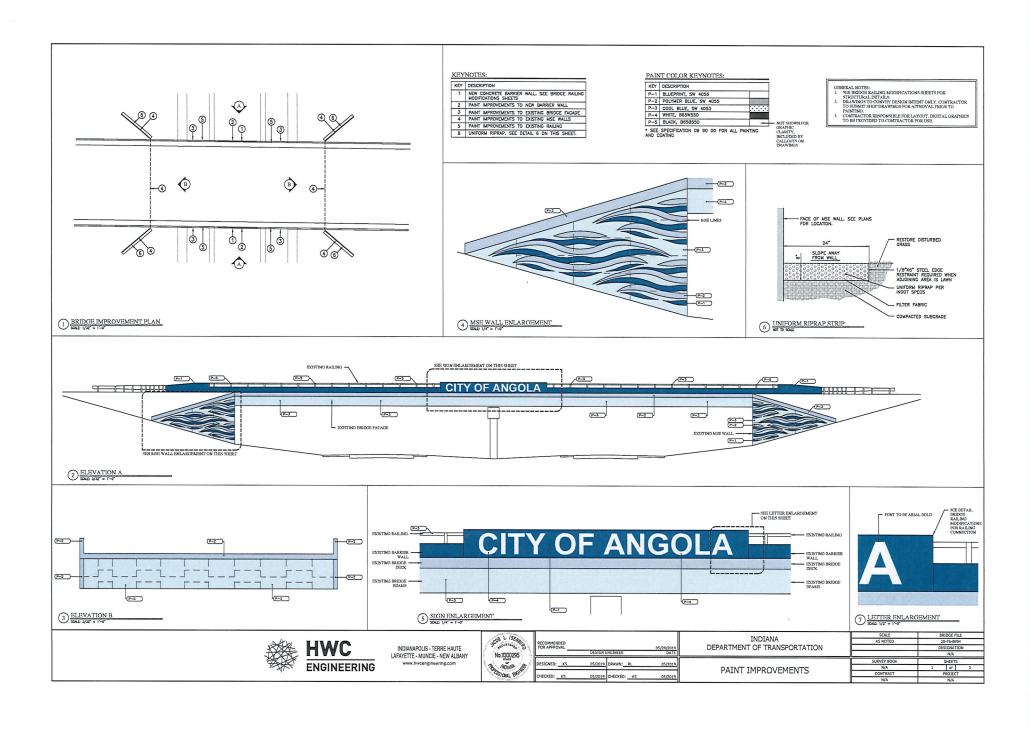
