Community Development encompasses all four of the points here combining the intangible aspect of community "hearts and minds" and the logistics of a well-functioning downtown. This area includes long-term projects.



Historic Preservation

The Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) helps to protect our community heritage by overseeing compliance with the City's historic preservation ordinance. The HPC is the gateway to approval for the Facade Grants presented to the Common Council, which Downtown Services helps to facilitate.



Community Liaison

Downtown Services helps connect the downtown community and its organizations with local government information and resources. It also serves as a liaison for the City of Angola Main Street organizaiton and works with the State of Indiana's Office of Community and Rural Affairs.



Marketing/Promotions

In order to enhance downtown Angola's public profile, Downtown Services, works alongside partners to enhance, develop and promote quality of place initiatives and events. This area encompasses advertising/prmotion as well as events.

BUILDING CAPACITY

Downtown Services works to encourage and collaborate with individuals and organizations to help build capacity in leadership and resources with a focus on downtown. Supporting and working with the Downtown Angola Coalition to become the "go to" leadership group in downtown has been a focus in 2018. Downtown Services was instrumental in the development and reinstatement of a new Indiana Main Street organization in May of 2017, helping to build a coalition of individuals and organizations since 2015. This added capacity will increase the number of community led initiatives and events.

PROJECTS AND EVENTS


Thanks to the support of City employees and County public safety personnel in the implementation of events. In particular, the incredible folks at City Police, Fire, Street and Planning Departments and Steuben County EMA and 911 Communications.

Rural arts took front stage in 2018 with the Hometown Collaboration Initiative decision to choose leadership as their building block and developing, with a newly formed Mayor's Arts Council, a sculpture tour in downtown Angola based on placemaking data and other criteria. An unveiling of the sculptures is scheduled on June 15, 2019. The Hometown Collaboration Initiative gathered local data to help in its decision making, with a community wide survey and Public Forum.

Downtown Services utilized a Trine University student intern for a semester in 2018. The intern worked on social media imagery, took photographs for marketing purposes at Cruise to the Monument and formatted Historic Preservation Commission research for their annual tours.

The Downtown Angola Coalition (DAC) became a federally recognized non-profit entity with their 501c3 designation in 2018. The year was transitional, as they learn to become more self reliant. Due to their Main Street status, Downtown Services offers assistance to help build leadership and often is a partner on events that require City resources. Currently their focus is Health and Recreation and Arts and Culture.
